Deadline: 15-May-2023

In order to be considered for the award, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Must have less than 5 years of experience in the financial services industry
- Must be a first-time attendee to the Advocis Banff School
- Must be insurance licensed and hold a recognized financial planning designation (or registered and in the process of completing one. i.e. PFA, CFP, CLU)
